
General meeting 15 February 2017

6 December 2016 was down as the judicial review hearing over the 2015 WARO review outcome which saw openings to WARO in the Ruahines, Tararuas and Rimutakas. However there was a delay as the judge was concerned as to whether the WARO operators had been given adequate opportunity to be involved as they are an affected party if she reverses the decision. The concern is that they would otherwise have an appeal option and she wants a robust decision. To date none of the WARO operators have requested representation.

OSPRI TB-FREE


Have notified that the scheduled 1080 drop for the southern Rimutakas has been deferred until "later this year".


CONDOLENCES


